## Shooting Star Garden opens at Wrexham Maelor Hospital

The latest development by the Shooting Star Appeal has opened at Wrexham Maelor Hospital.



After funding the development of the first Macmillan Information Centre in Wales, the Appeal has now supported the creation of a patients' garden alongside the Information Centre.

This garden is designed to be a tranquil outdoor space for cancer patients, their families and carers when visiting the Hospital or Information Centre.

The design and construction of the garden has been through a collaboration between Glyndŵr University students, Jill Scorer studying Art and Design for Landscape and Colm Trevor studying Applied Arts.

Although it is located in the middle of the Hospital site it has been carefully designed to ensure privacy and to take advantage of its location alongside the River Gwenfro.

A pathway from the Information Centre runs alongside the river, ending in a circular garden with seats and decorative glass panels which feature images of the Froncysyllte Aqueduct. These continue one of the themes set by the artworks in the main Shooting Star Unit, where a tiled wall, ironwork balustrade and tapestries illustrating the development of the lands around Wrexham reflect the area's industrial heritage.

Pam Wedley, the Information Centre manager, said:

“We are delighted that we can now offer patients and their families this outdoor area.

“As the plants get established and start to fill out it will provide a secluded area where patients can sit, read through our information or chat to a member of the information team. And hopefully the recent fine weather will continue so that we can make maximum use of the area for the rest of the summer.”

Nonna Woodward, who chairs the Board of Trustees of the Shooting Star Appeal said:

“Although the Appeal was initially just set up to build the Shooting Star Unit at the Hospital, the local community clearly took the cause to their hearts and we still receive donations. I am delighted that we are able to use these to fund these additional developments and to purchase equipment that enhances the care of cancer patients from our region.”
