Tiny Tums Project

Six Childrens' Nurseries in Conwy County Borough have received Certificates for Continued Best Practice in Food and Nutrition. These nurseries join the 13 nurseries who received certificates in February this year. The 6 successful nurseries are :

The Tiny Tums project started in 2008 and sets standards for quality, food provision and food safety in the Early Years sector. The project is a partnership with Conwy Council's Food Safety section and the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board Dietetic Department.

The certificates were awarded at an event at the Old School Centre, Church Walks, Llandudno. The Lady Mayor of Llandudno, Mrs Ann Yates, presented the certificates and said "I commend the nurseries attending this very worthwhile and relevant course - these people are working with the next generation, and nutrition is a very important area when children are developing."

Steven Grayson, Head of Dietetics for the Health Board said "Children require plenty of energy and other nutrients to ensure they grow and develop normally. Children have special requirements - they are not mini adults. The Tiny Tums Project helps nurseries to provide for the under 5s in their care."

A further course will be offered in the Autumn for any other nurseries to attend.
