Ospreys Rugby Club visit Glan Clwyd Hospital

Tomorrow, 13th August, forty six members of the Ospreys Rugby Club will be visiting wards at Glan Clwyd Hospital to remind staff, patients and visitors of the importance of good hand hygiene.

The visit has been organised by RWE npower renewables as part of their Communities Programme and follows on from the visit to the Hospital by Gavin Henson and Gareth Owen that they arranged in 2008.

This time the players have agreed to act as hand hygiene ambassadors around the Hospital, and after getting a briefing from the Hospital's Infection Control team they will be going out around the Hospital to spread the word to staff and patients.



Reena Cartmell, Assistant Director of Nursing, said "We are pushing forward with our 'bare below the elbows' campaign, not only at Glan Clwyd but in all our Hospitals. This encourages members of staff to wear short sleeves so it is easier for them to wash their hands thoroughly when moving from one patient to another.

"We are always looking for new ways to keep reminding staff of the importance of hand hygiene and when we heard that the Ospreys wanted to visit we asked if they would kindly help us to publicise this campaign.

"They will also be encouraging patients to ask staff if they have washed their hands before treatment. They will also be reminding visitors of the part they can play in not spreading infections by using the alcohol hand rub when going onto wards, and not visiting if they have themselves been ill recently."
