Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board Celebrates High Achievers

The contribution of staff and volunteers to the work of the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board has been recognised with a special awards ceremony.

The inaugural annual Achievement Awards recognised the contribution and commitment of staff and volunteers across North Wales.

Mary Burrows, Chief Executive of the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board said: "It was a great pleasure to acknowledge our colleagues who have made a special contribution to the services we deliver to the people of North Wales. We recognise that our greatest resource is the people who work within our Health Board as staff or volunteers. We are delighted to take this opportunity to celebrate their commitment, energy and excellence."



There were twelve categories in total with the winners detailed below:

Evidence into Practice

Sisters Janet Lloyd Jones and Nicky Roberts from Ysbyty Glan Clwyd, along with their staff and patients have developed an Intentional Rounding Log, which is a tool which measures and charts patients comfort.

The tool includes skin inspections, positioning of the patients, accessibility to the call bell and enhances communication with patients, relatives and staff.

Most Outstanding Contribution to Improving the Life of Patients

Peter Edwards, a Physiotherapist from Abergele delivers a faultless service to his patients in the outpatient department and on the wards of Colwyn Bay Community Hospital.

He constantly demonstrates patience and understanding with his clients, many of whom have complex conditions such as Multiple Sclerosis and Stroke. Peter is always bright, cheerful and demonstrates skill in communicating with and treating a very varied caseload.

Improving Patient Safety

The administrative staff from the HM Stanley Eye Unit are worthy winners of this category. The team deal with over 44,000 outpatients and 5,000 inpatients per year and include patients with sight threatening eye conditions.

As ophthalmology practice has changed drastically over the last few years, the administrative staff have risen to the challenge and their dedication and hard work has played a vital part in preserving and indeed improving the sight of many patients from across North Wales.

Services to Bilingual Healthcare

Staff Nurse Sali Burns and Dr Elin Walker-Jones a Clinical Psychologist have a passion for the Welsh language and this has been a major factor in ensuring that the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board is the envy of other Health Board in Wales in terms of its ability to provide the public and patients with a bilingual healthcare service.

They offer assistance and guidance to lead the Mental Health Clinical Programme Group (CPG) forward, enabling services to engage with Welsh speaking communities. Coming from Welsh backgrounds, both deeply recognise and empathise with Welsh speaking communities. They are currently developing a database of Welsh speaking staff within the CPG, which will enable the service to direct and appoint Welsh speaking staff to Welsh speaking patients.

Contribution to the Wider Community

Mr Asad Syed, a Consultant in Orthopaedics and Trauma in Wrexham Maelor Hospital was nominated for this award for his diligence and extreme dedication as part of the NHS Consultant-led Charity UK MED. This Charity performs limb salvage surgery and life saving interventions in international disaster zones.

Mr Syed has operated on victims in the Kashmir earthquake of 2005, Indonesian earthquake in Sumatra in 2007, the China earthquake in 2008 and was one of the surgeons who collected equipment and led the orthopaedic interventions in the Haiti earthquake of 2010.

Outstanding Voluntary Contribution

Lian Lynch is a volunteer within the Chaplaincy Service at Ysbyty Gwynedd. She generously devotes large amounts of her time and expertise to provide a tremendous source of counselling support to patients and staff.

She has been the driving force behind the development of the Renal Unit Befriending Service in Ysbyty Gwynedd. During extra-ordinary events, Lian has demonstrated a totally selfless commitment to her voluntary work, which is an inspiration to those who know her.

Haydn Hughes Award

Keir Harding from the Deeside Community Mental Health Team has made a substantial contribution to his team and to the Health Board in general and has been the driving force behind the group Taith, who have achieved national recognition for their work with clients with personality disorders.

Keir has worked diligently and creatively to support staff in working with and improving services available to clients, which include a Coping Skills Group, Personality Disorder (PD) Support Sessions and more importantly, his work with Taith.

Excellence in Leadership

Anwen Naylor, is the Nurse Team Manager for the Child Development Specialist Children's Service based in Bryn Seiont, Caernarfon. During her day to day role, Anwen felt that there was a need for the service to identify challenging behaviours within her client group. She highlighted the need for more formal training in this area which led to her working with professionals from Bangor University. This work culminated in various Diploma modules being developed such as Positive Approaches to Challenging Behaviour and Working with Disabled Children and their families.

Anwen has also developed her team, which includes Children's Nurses and Learning Disability Nurses

New Ways of Working

Marianne Walmsley and Sharon Jones, both from Anglesey were nominated for their excellent contribution to moving forward the hugely successful New Ways of Working Project and the UK Pilot 'Designed for Competence'. This project involved

redesigning roles within the healthcare team and establishing competences which were used to redesign the future curriculum for education provision.

In addition, it also focussed on reducing demand on hospital based services, providing more care within the home and community setting.

Working in Partnership

The Criminal Justice Liaison Team based in Colwyn Bay were worthy winners of this category. They were involved in establishing the Criminal Justice Mental Health Group which is a multi-agency group which provides an interface between health and criminal justice systems. Excellent working relations have been formed with local catchment area prisons and effective care co-ordination for prison leavers is much improved as a result.

The use of co-location within Probation Service offices has enabled the team to develop seamless systems which significantly improve the access to mental health services for individuals involved in a criminal justice process,

Dr E C Benn Award

This sponsored award recognises longstanding professional achievement.

Dr Dawn Wimporoy is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist and specialises in working with children with autism and autistic spectrum disorders.

During her career, Dr Wimporoy has provided supervision, training and consultation to countless staff working in children's services, provided a high quality diagnostic and therapeutic service to families of children with autism and carried out internationally renowned research in the field of autism.

Advancing Equality Award

Due to the stigma experienced by some patients with HIV living in rural and close knit communities in North Wales, Dr Andrady, Consultant in Genito-Urinary Medicine and Val Anderson, HIV Specialist Nurse at Ysbyty Gwynedd developed a questionnaire 'Promoting Equality and Fairness for People with HIV or AIDS within a Healthcare Setting'.

The questionnaire was initially for patients attending the HIV clinic and the findings will be used to train and raise awareness of HIV/AIDS for staff who come into contact with HIV positive patients within healthcare settings.
